I. Greetings from the Board of Directors

As you know, Breastfeeding USA unveiled our <u>strategic plan for FY19-FY21</u> last November. We are excited about the continued growth of our organization and look forward to putting into action the goals outlined in that document.

From the President

Life comes at you fast. I've been with Breastfeeding USA in some capacity since I joined it on the day it was launched in December 2011. I've served on the board since 2014, a step driven half by my continued desire to support the organization and half by a few friends twisting my arm to be nominated. You might think all these years of experience would leave me feeling prepared now to serve this organization as its board's president ... and I guess you would be about half right. I'm excited and honored ... and I'm also more than a little trepidatious. Am I up to this task? How can I know?

Do we ever *really* feel prepared for life's next big challenge? Or fully qualified to serve when called to do so?

Years ago, I was trying to persuade an experienced breastfeeding mother that she would make a fabulous volunteer mother support counselor. She protested that her kids were still keeping her up half the night and the house was always a mess and she clearly didn't have it all together like the rest of us did. I smiled to myself, thinking of the dust bunnies and dirty dishes in my home at that very moment, and the frantic search I'd undertaken to find a shirt clean enough to wear to our meeting.

Then she finally got to the heart of the matter and confessed that she didn't feel qualified to support other mothers when her own mothering, in her eyes at least, so often fell short of ideal.

So I shared with her my own secret: I am grateful every day that I don't have to be perfect to help other people.

In fact, I've found that often it is in trusting others with our vulnerabilities—our dust bunnies, our doubts—that we end up bringing out the best in each other.

Breastfeeding USA is going through big changes. Some long planned and hoped for, others out of left field. I'm proud and honored to be trusted with an important leadership role in the midst of these changes. I can't promise to be perfect, and I certainly don't expect anyone else to be. But I can—and do—promise to show up, to listen, to discern, to act ... to lead. It's not a magic wand. It's not a guarantee. But it is a commitment.

Come join us. Come as you are, not as you might be on some future imagined day when you'll have it all together and be super qualified. Show up with your passion for our mission, your willingness to learn, your commitment to lift others up and be inspired by them in turn. We need you.

Advocacy

We are continuing our membership in the United States Breastfeeding Committee and recently participated in the Welcome Week for Congress. Breastfeeding USA will also have a presence at USBC's Ninth National Breastfeeding Conference and Convening in June.

We look forward to other lobbying efforts in the coming year.

Communications

Communications is seeking volunteers with social media, writing, and/or editing skills to help build our internal and external communications capacity. See the job calls below for more details.

As one action step of Strategic Plan Goal 1 (Deploy Technology Strategically), Communications in coordination with Volunteer Services and IT will be implementing guidelines for use and moderation of BC Discussion. This will reduce the number of emails that BCs receive daily and will help re-route queries to the appropriate committee or workgroup. Education

As of the end of January, 199 candidates are enrolled in the comprehensive course. Module 4 is now open in LearnWorlds, and the orientation module is in the final stage of revision. With these last steps in the transition of our course from Moodle to LearnWorld, a years-long goal to improve the candidate experience and volunteer workload of our course is on the verge of completion, reopening the pipeline from candidacy to accreditation.

Finance

We are formally re-staffing the Finance Committee as part of meeting Goal 2 of the Strategic Plan and in keeping with existing policy. Funding and Development

We are happy to announce our calendar year ended with two successful fundraising efforts:

- Giving Tuesday in November raised over \$2,800 for Breastfeeding USA. We are grateful to Nancy Mohrbacher for donating 10 copies of Working and Breastfeeding Made Simple to incentivize our BCs to participate in fundraising.
- Our year-end fundraiser, including the donor match, raised over \$2,200! We offer warm thanks to the founder whose generous \$1,000 match inspired over a dozen more people to give generously at the end of the year.

We'd like to thank again our donors, as well as Aimee Teslaw and Nicole Florek for their work on this effort, and all the BCs, volunteers, and families who participated in our fundraising.

Volunteer Services

Understaffing and life crises, large and small, have slowed some of VS's work recently. We are fortunate that BC Support has an able new manager, Gina Guariglia Kelly, and appreciate the work she and all the regional reps do day in and day out to help BCs pursue our mission in their own communities.

One task that has been interrupted by changes in staffing this past year is the manual transfer of complete CCAR data from the many submitted Google forms to the website, where BCs can see which months' CCARs have been received and processed. Please be assured that this work will be completed, hopefully with a more streamlined procedure to save volunteer labor.

As we pursue strategic plan goal #3 (which includes shifting to a culture of recognition and positive reinforcement), we anticipate continuing to change some of the ways we collect and use CCAR data organization-wide. For now, you are encouraged to continue <u>submitting your monthly CCAR</u> and to save the copy of your responses that is automatically emailed to you for each submission.

The Breastfeeding USA Communications Committee is looking for additional members for our **social media workgroup**. Currently, we maintain a presence on <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Twitter</u>; we plan to reboot our Instagram presence in the coming months.

Tasks in this workgroup include:


