I. Greetings from the Board of Directors

From the Board

On March 3 -- just six weeks ago -- <u>I emailed BC-discussion about COVID-19</u>. I knew by then that the disease would spread more widely in the mainland United States, but I was not capable at that time of imagining just how profoundly everyone's lives would be disrupted, whether by direct impact of the illness within our families or by the upheavals, uncertainties, and economic losses of closures, shutdowns, and stay-at-home orders.

My thoughts have been constantly with essential workers on the frontline of our healthcare, food supply, and public safety systems, and with their families, who together face either the increased risk of exposure or the hardships of separation. I think of those hospitalized, with COVID-19 or another diagnosis, or in nursing homes or other facilities, who cannot have visitors for everyone's safety. Of employed parents who must somehow juggle the demands of their newly work-from-home jobs with the pressing needs of their active children. Of families whose jobs have disappeared overnight and are facing bills they can't pay, worrying about how to put food on the table or keep a roof over their heads.

And, like all of you, I can't stop thinking about the expectant and new parents. They are giving birth and starting to breastfeed during a pandemic, with patchy systems of support that were already stretched thin. Too many of our mothers were already being traumatized by their birth

experiences and facing economic hardship and dangerous isolation in a society without guaranteed paid parental leave. How much worse must it be now?

Wherever you are in this mix of concerns, challenges, hardship, and upheaval: Breastfeeding USA cares about you, and we want to be a part of the support network that gets you and your family through this time. For some of you, just getting through each day is all you should expect to accomplish. We will cheer you on in that. For others, you may be feeling anxious to do more to help but uncertain where to start, how to make a difference. We have ideas and opportunities for new kinds of volunteer work that you can do from home.

Above all, I encourage you to stay grounded in the values and skills that already make you a good breastfeeding support counselor. Connect with folks where and how you can. Listen to them empathetically and with compassion. Discern and share reputable, evidence-based information in a media environment that excels at circulating the bad kind.

And, please: as you do what you can to help others, put your own care at the top of your daily priority list. More than ever before, your family and community NEED you to stay healthy and resilient.

Special Section on Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19)

As communities around the nation respond to the global <u>Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19)</u> <u>pandemic</u>, the USBC has continued to serve as a communication hub for the breastfeeding field. View the updated "<u>Infant and Young Child Feeding in Emergencies</u>" webpage for key

AAP:

- The American Academy of Pediatrics has published a report titled "<u>Initial Guidance: Management of Infants Born to Mothers with COVID-19</u>." The guidance addresses the care of infants whose mothers have confirmed or suspected COVID-19.
- The American Academy of Pediatrics has published a webpage titled "FAQs: <u>Management of Infants Born to Mothers with Suspected or Confirmed</u>
 <u>COVID-19</u>." The FAQs provide initial guidance for the management of infants born to mothers with confirmed or suspected COVID-19.
- CBC: The California Breastfeeding Coalition has released the recording and slides
 from a webinar titled "COVID-19: Infant Feeding During the Postpartum Period." The
 presentation discusses World Health Organization and Centers for Disease Control
 and Prevention guidelines and recommendations for infant feeding and COVID-19.
- Congress: Senator Robert Casey (D-PA) has introduced the "Food Assistance for Kids and Families During COVID-19 Act of 2020" (S.3563). The bill would modify nutrition programs to address the Coronavirus disease, including permitting state agencies administering the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) to extend the infant certification periods and women's postpartum eligibility to two years.
- COVID-19 Health Literacy Project: The <u>COVID-19 Health Literacy Project</u>, developed in collaboration with Harvard Health Publishing, has launched a series of fact sheets with accessible COVID-19 information to help all patients know when, and how, to seek care. The fact sheets have been translated into 35 languages and dialects. Media highlights include:
 - STAT: "New effort aims to provide Covid-19 resources to non-English speakers in U.S."
- DoD: The U.S. Department of Defense, Defense Health Agency has published guidance titled "DoD COVID-19 Practice Management Guide Clinical Management of COVID-19." The guidelines reflect the best information available to guide decision making in the management of COVID-19 patients. Included is information on screening and triage, infection prevention, specimen collection, clinical management, treatment options, telemedicine, emergency medical services, and ethical considerations. The guidance specifically addresses postpartum care and breastfeeding.
- EmbraceRace: EmbraceRace has published a webpage titled "<u>Disproportionate racial</u> impacts of COVID." The webpage compiles news links and resources addressing the uneven impact of COVID-19 on communities of color.
- HealthConnect One:

- HealthConnect One is hosting a webinar on Thursday, April 30, from 12-1
 p.m. ET titled "Supporting Birthing Families During COVID-19." The
 Executive Director of the African-American Breastfeeding Network will
 present on the importance of continuity of support from trusted peers in the
 community and how to adapt services during the pandemic.
- HealthConnect One has launched a story tool titled "Share your COVID-19
 experience with us / Comparta con nosotros su experiencia con el
 COVID-19." Individuals are invited to share about the needs and
 experiences of birthing families during the pandemic.

- The Human Milk Banking Association of North America has published a
 webpage titled "COVID-19." The webpage includes updated statements from
 HMBANA and resources regarding milk banking and donor milk.
- The Human Milk Banking Association of North America has released a statement titled "Why Donor Human Milk is an Essential Need During COVID-19." The statement describes the crucial role of donor human milk during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- IBLCE: The International Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners has published a
 document titled "IBLCE Advisory Opinion on Telehealth." The advisory addresses the
 provision of lactation consulting services via telehealth, particularly in light of
 COVID-19, and whether such services can be offered in accordance with IBCLC
 practice.
- KFF: The Kaiser Family Foundation has published a report titled "Novel Coronavirus 'COVID-19': Special Considerations for Pregnant Women." The report outlines considerations for how the pandemic may specifically impact pregnant women and summarizes what is known about pregnancy and COVID-19, including information on breastfeeding.
- The Lancet: The Lancet has published an article titled "<u>US NICUs and donor milk</u>
 <u>banks brace for COVID-19</u>." The article describes the adjustments that neonatal
 intensive care units and donor milk banks in the United States are making to address
 challenges related to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- NACHW: The National Association of Community Health Workers has published a
 webpage titled "COVID-19 Resources." The webpage compiles essential materials for
 community health workers addressing COVID-19.
- NCAI: The National Congress of American Indians has published a webpage titled "COVID-19: Resources for Indian Country." The webpage includes a database of letters sent by NCAI to the Administration on behalf of tribal nations in response to COVID-19, as well as other news and resources.
- UCSF: The University of California San Francisco has announced the <u>PRIORITY</u>
 (<u>Pregnancy CoRonavIrus Outcomes RegIsTrY</u>) <u>study</u>, a nationwide study of pregnant or recently pregnant women who are either under investigation for COVID-19 or have been confirmed to have COVID-19.

 ZERO TO THREE: ZERO TO THREE has published a state initiative report titled "States Modify Home Visiting Services in Response to COVID-19." The report tracks various steps states have taken to support home visiting programs during the pandemic.
