

# Inside Breastfeeding USA March 2019

## I. Greetings from the Board of Directors

The first public board meeting of 2019 was held on March 19. It included a financial report on the second quarter of our current fiscal year, the second required "reading" of the <u>revised bylaws</u>, and a vote to approve them, as well as an overview of the board's project management approach to implementing the strategic plan. The meeting closed with remarks from the president and discussion regarding member concerns and the need for a culture shift in treatment of volunteers at all levels.

#### From the President

Lead with love.

That's the phrase I keep coming back to in this new role as president of the Board of Directors. I reflected on it a little bit in my remarks during the board meeting, and it's been gratifying to see others picking it up as we carry the work forward.

Like most mantras or pithy catch phrases, it leaves a lot undefined. Our society doesn't always cultivate or honor women's leadership. And effective leading can take many forms and happen in many different roles. For a really beautiful and inspirational example of this, please read

For me, love has a lot to do with integrity and courage. I love our mission to provide evidence-based breastfeeding information and support to every family we can reach and to promote breastfeeding more broadly as both the biological and cultural norm. You don't have to venture far on the internet, though, to encounter hostility toward that cause, ugly assumptions about those who promote it, and beneath everything the whole complex corporate profit machine that wins biggest when parents wean early.

This advocacy work is how we confront the barriers and forces that obstruct and undermine our cause. Doing this work takes courage. Persisting in it takes more than outrage. It takes love.

The very same communication skills we teach our BCs for helping parents are invaluable in working with one another as well. Plans and deadlines are necessary for progress toward goals. Just as necessary is honest communication, open minds and hearts, empathy for one another's struggles and detours, praise and appreciation for shared efforts, and joy in celebrating our victories, small and large.

My involvement with Breastfeeding USA is one of the best things about my life right now. Can you say the same, honestly? If so, please let those you work with know; let us share in your joy. If not, can you identify what is missing for you, what would need to change to find more satisfaction and pleasure in your volunteer work? Help us make those changes, by leading with love.

## Volunteer Spotlight

This month we'd like to highlight the contributions **Karyn DiNovo** makes to Breastfeeding USA! Karyn serves as the Membership Manager for Funding & Development and a key Candidate Tracking volunteer for Education.

Here's what Aimee Teslaw said of Karyn in nominating her for the volunteer spotlight:

"I've worked with Karyn since I became Funding and Development chair, but I've actually known her since the beginning of my involvement with Breastfeeding USA in 2012, as we were in the

same cohort for our communications skills practice as candidates. We live on opposite sides of suburban Chicagoland, and so we've met in person at local conferences and meetups. Even before I worked with her I noticed that she is patient and kind, and that has proven to be true in her work in Membership. She is also highly organized and knowledgeable of the processes and systems we use in Membership, and was a quick study when we transitioned to using the CRM last year. I'm so glad she shares her time and skills with us at Breastfeeding USA. We are very lucky to have her."

Here's what Karyn shared about herself:

"I'm Karyn DiNovo, a BC from Shorewood,IL. I have a terrific husband who supports my passion for lactation and helping families breastfeed. I also have a 10 year old son, Vincent, who has grown



up around breastfeeding as both the biological and cultural norm for our extended family and friends.

I have been a BC for 6 years. At first I was a co-BC in Joliet then soon become a solo BC for the group. After a few years I decided to take on more of a role at the National level by volunteering with the Education committee in the Candidate Support workgroup. Soon after, I accepted the role of Membership Manager, in the Funding and Development committee. I am still involved with both, but my duties have grown in Candidate Support once we began the process of developing a new Learning Platform: Learn Worlds. Last year I took a step back from local BC meetings to focus solely at my volunteering at the National Level. My greatest joys in the volunteering have been transitioning Membership to CiviCRM, that I know will help grow our organization so much once all workgroups are integrated. Most recently we accredited our first class of BCs to complete the new learning platform. I continue to look forward in both my roles as we develop paperless membership cards (coming in the next year) and continue to grow Learn Worlds by enrolling current BCs and developing CEU modules.

My other roles in life include working in a research laboratory at Midwestern University in the department of Physiology, for 16 years. My husband and I are both invested in our son's passion for soccer as we travel with him to games and tournaments most weekends. My other volunteer role I share with my husband is our commitment to marriage, we are the local diocesan coordinators for the National branch of the Worldwide organization Catholic Engaged Encounter.

The one thing volunteering has taught me is to give of ourselves completely helps us grow stronger in our daily lives as women, as partners, as mothers, as friends and as co-workers, but in order to do so family time and self care must become a priority. I am grateful Breastfeeding USA has so many options for women to volunteer in their communities and nationally, all with the same goal: to empower women and breastfeeding families."

#### **Elections:**

We are seeking an Elections Chair for the 2019 year! This is a seasonal position for BfUSA (March - November) perfect for someone with punctual communication skills. The main job is releasing announcements; soliciting a committee and candidates; managing email list and the elections roster; and maintaining confidentiality throughout. Supporting documents and training available. Commitment time per week can vary, but July, August, and September are the busiest times.

#### Job Description:

- a. Job Responsibilities:
  - Recruits members of the Election Committee
  - Through communication with the Board Secretary, identifies the specific Board needs and the number of seats available on the Board of Directors
  - Publicizes the open Board of Directors positions and desired qualifications to the Voting Members, and calls for nominations
  - Actively seeks qualified nominations
  - Presents the slate of candidates and their statements to the Voting Members
  - Arranges for ballots to be available to all Voting Members, and for ballots to be cast and counted in a classified manner
- b. Job Requirements:
  - Organized; provides written reports to the Board of Directors in a timely manner
  - Communicates effectively in writing
  - Keeps confidential all private information of candidates

#### Communications:

The Breastfeeding USA Communications Committee is looking for additional members for our **social media workgroup**. Currently, we maintain a presence on <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Twitter</u>; we plan to reboot our Instagram presence in the coming months.

Tasks in this workgroup include:

- Curating external content that may be of interest to our social media followers. This
  involves identifying items to share, participating in the vetting process, and creating a
  header "hook" to go with that content.
- Monitoring our social media accounts for comments and shares; assisting with responses to messages via social media.
- Connecting with like-minded organizations and breastfeeding advocacy efforts via social media.
- Developing campaigns with original Breastfeeding USA content.
- Engaging readers with questions.

We are in particular need of one or more BCs who are **Instagram** "savvy" who would be willing to take the lead on building our presence on that platform.

We'd also welcome volunteers with **meme-creation** skills - experience working with graphics, images, etc - to help us create eye-catching images for social media and other marketing.

**Newsletter Writers/Editors:** The strategic plan calls for the development of an inward facing newsletter (like this one!) and the expansion of the public facing #milkmemos to a monthly publication. To work towards these goals, we need volunteers interested in curating content, writing content, and editing/assembling content.


